It \* Soreness of gums most frequently is caused by plaque building up around the space where the teeth meet the gums. Although it may seem harm- toms, call your vet for a dental less it can lead to some pretty seri- exam and tooth cleaning. Most ous problems if left untreated. Some tale-tell signs are:

\* Bad breath

Does Your Dog Have Periodontal \* Tartar buildup (brown or tan, hard material on the teeth, close to gum line)

- \* The presence of pus (teeth may abscess)
- \* Teeth that are discolored or dark
- \* Red, inflamed or swollen gums
- \* Loss of appetite

If you notice any of these symptooth problems can be treated successfully. Don't delay dental treatment and care. If you do, you may

be contributing to serious health problems later on.

Some tips for helping to prevent dental problems:
